RHYTHMS

ISAIAH 11:1-10

In a bigger group, divide into 3-5 people to share:

Gratitude - God promises peace even in the middle of brokenness. What's one thing you can give thanks to God for this week?

 How have you experienced God's peace even in the midst of challenging circumstances?

Challenge - We live between two advents. Although Jesus began a kingdom of peace at the first advent we wait for its complete fulfillment at his second advent.

• What current burden is blocking the peace that Jesus wants to offer you? Pray for those things as a group.

Confess - "...the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea" – Isa 11.9b. For God's people, knowing the Lord was more than acquiring information but was connected to a deeper intimate relationship with him.

 Where in your life do you need to allow the knowledge of the Lord become more personal to you?

Bless - Reflect on how God shown blessing to you or through you this past week.

- In what ways have others been a blessing to you or you this past week? Who has God put on your path that you could be a bless to this week?
- What family, neighbors, or co-workers is God bringing to your mind that you could invite to church during the advent season?

Prayer - Bring each other's gratitude and challenges before the Lord together



What if there is PEACE?

LISTEN - ISAIAH 11:1-10

What if real peace can be found in the midst of brokenness?

The context of Isaiah 11 is not calm or stability, but political collapse, spiritual apathy, and national trauma. And yet *right there*, God announces a coming King—a shoot from the stump of Jesse—who will bring a kingdom of true peace.

The Stump & the Shoot – Peace in the Middle of Chaos

Pastor Dan described Israel as being in one of the darkest and most broken moments in their history.

 Where in your life right now does the world feel more like a **stump** than a flourishing tree? What part of Isaiah's picture of the Messiah offers you hope in that place?

The Spirit-Empowered King

Isaiah describes the coming King as being filled with the Spirit of the Lord—wisdom, counsel, strength, knowledge, and the fear of the Lord.

- What stood out to you about Jesus choosing to live as a fully human life as fully God through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit? (cf. John 5:19-20; 30, 6:38,8:28-29)
- How does His example encourage you that you can follow Jesus because the same Holy Spirit that empowered and led him lives in you?

Peace Deeper Than Circumstances

Isaiah shows a peace that is bigger than the absence of trouble—wolves and lambs together, children safe near danger, all creation restored.

- When you think of "peace," what comes to mind? How is biblical peace (shalom) different from how our culture defines peace?
- Where have you been tempted to look for peace apart from Christ?
- Isaiah's vision ends with the whole earth filled with the knowledge of the Lord. How does knowing the end of the story help you walk through your current challenges?
